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1.7 Key Findings

- 1) Youths with harder back grounds insist the lessons they learnt growing up taught them to find their own means to survive;
- 2) It's hard for youth to engage in something sensible for the facts that they are distracted by the excitement of quick-earning cash;
- 3) 90 % of the young people claimed they was frustrated with their own lifestyle;
- 4) The young people spoke a lot about being recognised as adults who are capable enough to handle situations and they want more respect from elders;
- 5) Youths are too ambitions to sit in the seats of low roles. so they choose to be a boss where they can show and deliver their own skills;
- 6) Youths said that when they were disrespected by others they admitted being blind sighted by revenge and didn't care about their own wellbeing afterwards;
- 7) As time progresses youth are creating their own atmosphere and environment that will make it harder to work with them in the future.

Our 7 Key Findings came through provisions of; questionnaires, question & answer sessions, observation, one-on-ones, open discussion and product/project/young people assessments.

2. Measurable Outcomes

- \checkmark Employed 9 staff, 2 facilitators and a floatation of 10 volunteers;
- $\sqrt{84}$ young people used our training suite;
- $\sqrt{52}$ were new registrations;
- $\sqrt{10}$ Out of the 84 young people, 67 were males and 17 were females;
- $\sqrt{8} = SW9 | 12 = SW2 | 8 = SE11 | 1 = SE15 | 4 = SW11 | 1 = SE19 |$ 1 = SW1 | 19 = SW8 | 1 = SE21 | 1 = SE26 | 2 = SE5 | 16 = SW4 |1 = SE1 | 1 = CR0 | 1 = CR7 | 7 = UNKNOWN
- $\sqrt{}$ Our Training Suite was used **441 times**;
- $\sqrt{}$ Code 7 completed **19** written references to help gain employment and further education for **16 young people and 2 senior community people**;
- $\sqrt{\text{Code 7 guided 10 young people}}$ into part time or full time employment through our P.U.R.P.O.S.E and CIN projects, 1 volunteered to assist in the studio, 1 worked in admin assisting in funding applications and helped in outreach;
- $\sqrt{}$ Code 7 employed **2 young people** in Admin as Youth Trainees;



3. Achievements/Progress for the Year

- Code 7 are completing 3 years of our 3rd 3 year grant from BBC Children In Need;
- Code 7 secured a European Music Recording Agreement for 1 young staff member and 1 former youth trainee;
- Code 7 helped to successfully manage and deliver Brixton's yearly festival Brixton Splash;
- Code 7 was given the opportunity to host a day at our Training Suite for Angel the RnB singing sensation, curtesy of BBC Children in Need;
- Code 7 delivered the first ever music workshops at the Nation of Islam offices;
- Code 7 enabled young people to complete 20 quality music productions and 5 video productions;
- Code 7 intervened and mediated 3 separate gang related situations and gained peaceful outcomes;
